Combined Choir Sings for Patriarchal Divine Liturgy

A combined choir of 142 voices sang for the Patriarchal Divine Liturgy at Compuware Arena on November 12, 2000. Choir members from Annunciation Cathedral, Detroit: Assumption, St. Clair Shores; Holy Cross, Farmington Hills; Holy Trinity, Lansing; Holy Toledo; Trinity, Saints Constantine & Helen, Westland: Saint Demetrios, Saginaw; Saint George, Bloomfield Hills; Saint George, Southgate; Saint John, Sterling Heights; Saint Nicholas, Ann Arbor and Saint Nicholas, Troy rehearsed each weekend for two months in preparation for the visit of His All-Holiness. George S. Raptis, a church musician for more than fifty years and currently the assistant director at Saint John in Sterling Heights, was the conductor.

Choir friends from other parts of the Detroit Diocese - Grand Rapids, MI; Cincinnati, OH; Buffalo, NY; Rochester, NY and Indianapolis, IN joined us for the Patriarchal weekend. Guests from Los Angeles, CA; Monessen, PA; Columbus, OH and Falls Church, VA also joined the choir for the events of the weekend.

In addition to the Divine Liturgy on Sunday, the choir also for the Ecumenical sang Doxology Service held Saturday at Annunciation Cathedral. A stirring rendition of Axion Estin echoed through the Cathedral as Patriarch Bartholomew, Archbishop Demetrios, Bishop Nicholas and all the visiting hierarchs and clergy entered the Cathedral. An abbreviated Doxology and several other hymns were chanted during the service. The service ended with the jubilant sound of the Patriarchal Polychronion.

Many thanks to all of the choir members who gave many hours rehearsing and preparing for this most memorable occasion.
