

Metropolitan's Message

My Beloved Family in Christ,

Christ is Risen! Truly He is Risen!

It is with the full joy and love of all of our Clergy, our Metropolis Council, and our Metropolis Philoptochos that I have this opportunity to extend the Paschal greeting to you and your families.

We have come through a period of fasting and selfexamination, of self-denial and quiet, a period of reflection and prayer, and now we have arrived to this blessed period of Pascha when we proclaim the joy of the Resurrection of Christ. Indeed, this unique event in human history has effectively changed the world. From a small group of people who lived and walked and talked with Jesus – the group of people that now calls Him Lord covers the world. Mighty is His name!

It is my prayer that in this joy you and I will have felt a change in our hearts and in our lives. In offering Himself for us, our Lord gave the ultimate sacrifice of the Divine so that our human frailty and mortality could be changed and uplifted.

And so we are called upon to consider how we may have been changed by the love and self-sacrifice of God for us.

Have we actually understood that God has changed our lives forever? Have we recognized that with each Pascha we are called upon to be raised up from the darkness of the sin of our human mortality into the Light of the Eternal Kingdom of God?

Before we come to the end of the 40 days of Jesus on earth and his Ascension into the heavens, I would ask that each of us stop and consider how our minds, hearts, and souls can now be renewed. In truth, the Lord has opened the door of change for us - but we must we willing to walk through that door.

In these next forty days, as we share the greeting "Christ is Risen!" with each other, please remember that this greeting is our own personal call to change and growth. Each of us has been called out of the darkness of our own personal sin and mortality into the reality of the Kingdom.



Now that the musically busy days of Holy Week, Pascha, and Bright Week are over, we take this time to mark the contributions made by all church musicians - clergy, chanters, choir directors and singers - during the beautiful services we all experienced. The preceding weeks were times of many special hymns, many additional services, and many hours of rehearsals. In addition to their regular participation in Divine Liturgies and sacraments, our church musicians served at Presanctified Wednesday liturgies, Heretismoi services, and Saturdays of the Souls during Lent; they offered hymns and prayers at more than 20 services during Holy Week; and they were the first to proclaim " $\Delta \epsilon \dot{\nu} \tau \epsilon \Delta \dot{\alpha} \beta \epsilon \tau \epsilon \Phi \omega \varsigma$ "/ Come Receive the Liaht" and "Χριστός Ανέστη"/"Christ is Risen" congregations to anticipating the Resurrection in darkened churches. The past several months were indeed marathons of love and service!

Now our members turn to their next large endeavor: the annual MEFGOX Convention. This year, our 71st continuous year of being established, our convention is being hosted by the choir and parish of Annunciation in Dayton, Ohio. It will occur on the weekend of July 19th - 22nd.

What does such a convention entail? In short, MEFGOX conventions are a combination of

musical, educational, spiritual, and friendshipbuilding events. The aim is to provide resources and experiences that participants can take home to their parishes.

Almost immediately upon arrival, conventioneers are immersed in workshops that serve a variety of purposes: through them, they will learn new ideas congregational participation, a cappella singing, and increasing involvement of young adults and new parishioners in church music; they will practice musical techniques to take home for choir improvement; they will learn more about their faith and its hymnology. Spiritually, convention participants are afforded opportunity to interact more closely with our two hierarchs (Metropolitan Nicholas and Metropolitan Savas) and to participate in a Hierarchical Liturgy with a choir larger than they may ever experience at home. Participants also encounter a taste of new music repertoire, this year under the leadership of an experienced and excellent guest director, Maritsa Madias-Kalasz from Sts. Constantine and Helen Church in Westland, Michigan. Because MEFGOX is blessed with a jurisdiction that includes parishes from both the Detroit and Pittsburgh Metropolises, convention participants have the wonderful opportunity to interact with diverse church musicians from a variety of parishes with an array of ideas about church music - coming away with new ideas, useful resources, and opportunity for long-lasting friendships across parish and metropolis lines!

We hope that all our parishes will see how advantageous it is to support and representatives to this year's MEFGOX Convention in Dayton. All are invited, and all are promised a productive, satisfying weekend of singing, learning, and enjoyment. Reach Hither Your Finger...

Christ is risen!

Beloved, have you seen death? Have you known the unforgiving touch of stone? Have you experienced the unfathomable emptiness of lost hope? Have you ever borne inexpressible grief? Have you once stared into the incomprehensible depth of an abyss?

Today, out of death comes Life! Out of unforgiving stone, comes Forgiveness for all. Out of emptiness, the Plenitude of Grace. Out of grief, there comes a trembling joy, out of the abyss, an Abyss of Compassion. Out of the existential certitude of death, there stands before us today, an 'unbelievable' image of wounds, and... Life! Today, through closed doors, the Lord enters into the midst of the disciples as the stunning Radiance of a luminous, metaphysical reality. Cognizant of our fears, He gives us His Peace. He stands before us, Who is the absolute certainty of Hope. Here stands the tangible expression of Joy reclaimed.

Here before our eyes, are traumas too great to be comprehended... "Reach hither thy finger, and put it into the mark, reach hither thy hand, and THRUST it into my side, and be not faithless, but believing". "Then," say the scriptures, "were the Disciples glad when they saw the Lord". What is this gladness they experienced at seeing the Life of all bearing such traumas triumphantly? What is this sense of anticipation, as the twin dared to touch the sacred sub-structure of Life?

And yet, "He breathed on them", and said, "receive the Holy Spirit". He gave them authority to bind and to loose. Why now? Why at this point, after Himself being bound, does He give to the disciples the imperative to bind and loose? Why does He now reassure us that whatever we bind and loose on earth, will be bound and loosed in Heaven? Having been bound Himself, He looses. He gives His Peace liberally to those bound by fear. He binds them together who were scattered when He was smitten. He enjoins us to co-create with Him a new heaven and a new earth. The Resurrection of All bids us to untie the great 'knot' of our life.

Without binding, there is no potentiality of loosing. Without retaining sins, there is no potential for forgiveness. Without justice, there can be no mercy. He invites us now to probe His hands and His side more deeply... to investigate His righteous judgements, and to be in awe of the well-spring of His mercy. He bids us to penetrate more deeply into life, to be bold enough in our doubts, to be certain beyond measure in the confession of our Faith. And, to know beyond seeing that He is indeed, our Lord and God!

Truly He is risen!


