Metropolitan's Message

Beloved Family in Christ,

We are certainly in the midst of a hectic time of year! Preparations for hosting or visiting family are underway, decorations are being hung, driveways may need shoveling, winter clothing must be pulled out of storage, and let us not forget all of those gifts to be purchased! This event that we celebrate every twenty-fifth of December is truly the ultimate gift - all of the prettily wrapped packages sitting under our trees being simply reflections with which we hope to honor the Giver of all that is good in our own small acts of giving.

I sat down to compose this letter on the feast of the Nativity of the Theotokos. I cannot think of a more perfect day on which to ponder the wondrous gift that is the Nativity of our Lord. That young virgin who gave birth over two thousand years ago is still the primary example of what it is to respond to the gift of God incarnate.

At the most basic level, Mary shows us that the response to God's gracious act of giving is humble acceptance. God makes His offer to her to bear His Son freely and without expectation: it is up to her to accept or to refuse. So it is with us. God *already* has given us the greatest gift of His Son, and it is up to us to accept or reject that gift. Unlike many of the gifts that we give, this gift is given freely: there are no strings attached and no expectations.

Of course, as we see in the life of the Theotokos, accepting this gift does have certain consequences. For her, as for us, to accept the gift of the radical entrance of God into our very being is a life-altering reality. In allowing God to enter into our life, we are drawn into the life of the Trinity - from which all True Life eternally springs.

Finally, Mary did not remain simply a receiver of the gift of God, but she shared that gift of life given to her so that that life may spread throughout the world. How could she do otherwise? This gift was not hers to keep, and neither is the abundance of life poured into us. Just as she is revered throughout the world for

the gift of her son, we too can become tools of God's will when we receive the gift of Jesus in love and faith. We must remember that in keeping the Baby of Bethlehem in our hearts, by sharing Him in word and deed His grace can change the lives of all those whom we meet.

Therefore, my friends, I encourage all of us in this Holy Season to remember the abundance of God's freely given gift to us, so that we too might give the truth of the Baby born in a Manger to others – changing their lives forever. We are called upon to purposefully and intentionally share the reality of God and His love for us to everyone we meet.

May we be especially sensitive to God's guidance in this season characterized by the joy of giving. Then the love of God will be spread throughout the world, and we will begin to have a taste of peace on earth and goodwill towards all of mankind.

Holiday Blessings from MEFGOX for the FEAST OF THE NATIVITY!

Since July, church musicians of the Detroit Metropolis have been engaged in a variety of activities. Their 73rd Annual Convention was hosted by the St. Nicholas Church in Troy, where participating choir members and chanters celebrated the Divine Liturgy with His Eminence Metropolitan Nicholas and Father Stratton Dorozenski. Under the direction of Constantina Tsolainou of Dallas, the choir sang the newly-composed music of Nicholas Bodle, newly-elected President of MEFGOX from St. Paul Church in North Royalton, OH.

The Convention featured several workshops as part of its eductional goals, including one exploring the meaning and hymns of Communion by Father Anthony Cook and Evey Simon, another by Nancy Takis on the modes of Byzantine music, and a third by Metropolitan Nicholas and Deacon Bryce Buffenbarger on what it means to be an Orthodox church musician. The Federation also awarded two Memorial Scholarships to young church musicians: Victoria Martine of Holy Trinity Cathedral in Carmel, IN and Andrew Theophanous from St. John Church in Boardman, OH.

Other officers for the 2019-20 year include Vice-President Barbara Minton from St. George in Southgate, Secretary Elaine Charalambopoulos of Sts. Constantine & Helen in Westland, Treasurer Peter Vatsures of Annunciation in Columbus, and Immediate Past President Vicki Pappas of Annunciation in Buffalo. State Representatives for the Detroit Metropolis include Theodore Niforos for Detroit Metro, Cynthia Afendoulis for Outstate Michigan, Marny Payne for Indiana/Kentucky, Vicki Pappas for New York, Bill Hronas for Arkansas/Tennessee, and Valerie Baker for Western/Southwest Ohio. Father Teodor Petrutiu serves as Detroit Metropolis Spiritual Advisor.

Plans for the year include supporting local workshops, increasing involvement of youth in church music ministry, and expanding use of technology for communication and education. Next year's Convention will be held in conjunction with the Archdiocese's Clergy-Laity Congress in Cleveland and will be hosted by St. Paul Church in North Royalton. The MEFGOX Choir and visiting church musicians from the National Forum of Church Musicians will sing for the Archierarchical Divine Liturgy celebrated by His Eminence Archbishop Elpidophoros and our other Metropolitans.

As we draw close to the beautiful feast of the Holy Nativity, the members of the Mid-Eastern Federation of Church Musicians, choir members and chanters alike, extend heartfelt good wishes to Metropolitan Nicholas, our Reverend Fathers and Deacons, and all parishioners of the Metropolis.

During this joyful season, you will hear us singing and chanting the beautiful prayers which make up the special hymns of the Feast – join us as we praise the birth of our Lord!
