## Youth Participant Checklist

This is an important checklist for youth participants who are attending this year's Detroit HDF. Please read carefully and make sure to prepare/provide all necessary materials when checking in for the event. Make sure to give your **Emergency Medical Form** to the lead chaperone of your group. • All youth participants must give this form to their lead chaperone in order to participate. This form can be found at www.detroit.goarch.org/detroithdf. Youth whose parents/legal guardians will be at the event do not need to provide this document. • For individuals ages 19 and over, make sure they have come with health cards in case of an emergency. • Make sure to bring your necessary medications. Have them in their original containers in a plastic bag with your name so they are easy to find in case of an emergency. All participants (youth and chaperones) must be registered prior to the event. Workshop groups will be preassigned by age and cannot be changed. Review the Festival Guidelines for behavior with your parents and your church **chaperone(s).** All participants (youth and adult) are expected to behave in a manner that is befitting an Orthodox Christian.
