Philoptochos News By Margaret Yates—President



A record number of delegates (440) attended the Philoptochos Conference in Philadelphia in early July. Many first-time delegates were amazed at the agenda that seemed a little overwhelming at first glance. It was four full days and evenings of meetings, discussions, decision-making, budget review, committee reports, workshops and speakers.

We were enlightened by a panel discussion on mental illness entitled, "Our Community's Journey to Understanding, Compassion and Hope". Other presentations included human trafficking, the environment (On Earth As It Is In Heaven), family health and nutrition, emerging servant leaders, social services, literacy and "Our Orthodox Treasure/Friends of the Poor", to name a few.

Nine resolutions were presented to the delegates with six being defeated, one tabled for future consideration after more research, and two being approved.

First, the Cancer Fund be changed to the "Cancer and Other Major Illnesses Fund" and that the Fund be used for the purpose of financially assisting those experiencing cancer as well as other major illnesses.

The second resolution that passed was to Section 4 of the National Philoptochos Bylaws and shall now read:

"Following the election, and upon receipt of the ratification, the Parish Priest shall install the newly elected Chapter Board by administering the Oath of Office."

The first sentence of Section 5(c) shall now read:

"Within 14 days of the election of the Chapter Board, the names of the newly-elected Chapter Board shall be sent to the National Office for ratification".

If approved by His Eminence Archbishop Demetrios, these changes to the Bylaws will be uploaded on the Philoptochos website. These changes will have the greatest impact on chapters who have not submitted their election results in a timely manner in past years.

The 2014 Chapter Challenge was presented for the Metropolis of Detroit by Nikki Burns and Cindy Keiholz from the Annunciation Church in Dayton, OH. Their outstanding project, "American Heroes", was dedicated to all Veterans and those men and women currently serving our country. Every church organization got involved in this project with the VA Hospital in Dayton especially impacted by their generosity. The 2016 Chapter Challenge nominee is the Annunciation Philoptochos in Buffalo, New York.

The tears shed during the American Heroes presentation were just a warm-up! "The Brave Ones, Past and Present: A Tribute to Those Who Safeguard our Freedom" was a slide and patriotic music presentation to honor men and women who have served their country. Nearly 1,000 pictures of our Philoptochos military family from WWI to the present graced the screen, including former marine Metropolitan Isaiah of the Metropolis of Denver who was at the presentation.

Awards were presented to twenty-eight of our thirty-six active chapters in the Metropolis for completing all National Commitment obligations (Chicago and New Jersey were at 100%). In addition, the Soteria Chapter in Dayton received a first place award for Most Successful Fundraiser Project and the Philoptochos chapter in Buffalo, NY received a 1st Place Runner-up Membership Growth and Participation Award for chapters with 100 to 199 members.

From the many nominations, from chapters throughout the Metropolis, one member is selected to receive the AGAPE Award (All Generations Accomplishing Philanathropic Endeavors) at the conference. The 2014 recipient from the Metropolis of Detroit was Evanthia Valassiades from Dayton, OH. Evanthia, a tireless worker for both her chapter and the Metropolis where she has served on the Board for many years, is truly deserving of this prestigious award that epitomizes the true spirit of philanthropia.. Congratulations Evanthia!

In recognition of National President Aphrodite Skeadas's final term of office, all delegates, His Eminence Archbishop Demetrios, the Metropolitans and special guests gathered early on Wednesday morning for a breakfast in her honor to thank her for her outstanding leadership over the past six years. She has truly been an inspiration to all of us.

Each Metropolis received \$20,000 in grant monies to be distributed by the Metropolis President or her designee. Dr. Stephanie Poplos presented the grant to the Forrest Spence Fund in Memphis for needs of critically ill and chronically ill children and their families, Eleni Zaferes to the International Rett Syndrome Foundation in Cincinnati for medical research to develop treatments for Rett Syndrome, and Margaret Yates to the North Woodward Community Foundation in Troy for their Blessings in a Backpack program.

As an update to the Philoptochos Center of Philanthropy in NYC, the building is mortgage free, generating a monthly income, and set up with a \$100,000 evergreen fund to address future needs of the Center. The next undertaking for Philoptochos is to offer support to the resurrection of Saint Nicholas Church, destroyed on 9/11, as a National Shrine. The National Philoptochos Executive Board and Metropolis Presidents have already begun discussions on a plan of action to support this initiative.

In closing, I would like to include the words of His Eminence Archbishop Demetrios from a letter he sent to Mrs. Skeadas, the convention leadership and Ladies of Philoptochos. "I have come to know of the many highlights of your deliberations and decisions and I must commend you for the manner in which you carry out your ministry as Ladies of Philoptochos. You are organized, focused, thorough and filled with godly zeal and enthusiasm. Congratulations for your ability to mobilize the God given talents and resources of thousands of women across the country in a continuous mission of God's mercy and compassion."

My Soul Magnifies the Lord By Father Catalin Mot

And Mary said,

"My soul magnifies the Lord, and my spirit rejoices in God my Savior, for he has regarded the low estate of his handmaiden. For behold, henceforth all generations will call me blessed"

Dear brothers and sisters in Christ,

The Biblical text which I quoted above is taken from the Gospel of Saint Luke, chapter 1 verses 46-48. In our Church, we offer a great veneration to the Virgin Mary, the Mother of Our Lord and God and Savior Jesus Christ. And that veneration is expressed in various ways: in prayers, in hymns, in litanies / ektenias, in canons of prayers such as The Akathist and the Paraklesis to the Virgin, etc. I will highlight some aspects of our faith, in order to explain why do we do certain things, and why we venerate the Holy Virgin Mary.

The first reason is stated above, in the text I just quoted from, when the Virgin Mary exclaims: "All generations will call me blessed!" She is called blessed because she submitted herself totally to the will of God and was the first person in the world to accept Christ, offering an example to all of us of what does it mean to commit and to submit without question to the will of God.


Secondly, we venerate her because she accompanied our Lord, her beloved Son, everywhere He went, listening and accepting everything He said and did. Remember the wedding in Cana of Galilee, where the first miracles took place, when Jesus changed the water into wine, that it was she who said to Him: "They have no wine."

When Jesus was on the Cross, she was there with Him, alongside the women disciples and Saint John the Apostle and Evangelist. When Jesus saw them, He said to John: "Son, behold your Mother!" and to Her, "Woman, behold your son!" By saying that, the Lord made His own Mother, the Virgin Mary, the Mother of all humankind and this is another reason why we have such a great devotion to her. She is our Mother who protects, prays and intercedes for us sinners before the face of her beloved Son, to have mercy on us.

In my personal experience and devotion to the Virgin Mary, I have always felt protected and fortified in my faith when I performed a service dedicated to her

either at church or at home, when I kneel down before her icon and pray to her, and that's the way how all of us should feel, because she is "our shelter and protector," as we say in the service of Paraklesis.

During this blessed season of the Dormition Fast, let us all unite with each other in prayer and say: "Yπεραγία Θεοτόκε, Σώσον ημάς / Most Holy Theotokos, save us!"
