DELIBERATE ACTS OF KINDNESS

Random acts of kindness...Why must they be random? Now, don't get me wrong! It is great that people will randomly pay for someone's coffee at the local coffee shop. It is awesome that people will leave unexpected notes of Christmas cheer at their neighbor's doorstep. But have we limited our spirit of giving and kindness to fleeting, spontaneous feelings of generosity?

We must remember that God's mercy and love were never random or fleeting thoughts. God's love and mercy is deliberate... or with a purpose. Therefore, our love for God and each other should be the same. Generosity, almsgiving, and caring for our neighbor is supposed to be part of our every day Christian life and reality. So Christmas is a great time to begin putting this Christian discipline into practice. Let's spend the rest of the year making it a way of life!

Here are some Scriptural passages and reflections to further understand how we can use our God-given talents and treasures.

READ AND REFLECT: Consider the Scriptural quote from Matthew 10:8 "Freely you have received, freely give." List as many blessings as you can think of in your life. Whether you've been given one blessing or 100 blessings, take a moment to consider those who might be without even one of those blessings. For example, consider what it might be like for those who do not have a home. Consider what it might be like for those who do not have any family to be with at Christmas or any other holiday. Now... consider what you can do for those who go without these blessings. How can you (your youth group, your family) make a deliberate choice to give of your own gifts out of the gifts/blessings you have been given?

READ AND REFLECT: Read and discuss the Parable of the Good Samaritan (Luke 10:30-37)

The good Samaritan did more than give the man money. He tended to his wounds, took him to an inn, and provided for his needs until he was well. Why do we sometimes turn away from those in need? What are our assumptions about those who are poor or in need? What are some of the things we can do for others who are in need? How can you (your youth group, your family) make a deliberate choice to provide for those in need?

READ AND REFLECT: Read and discuss the Parable of the Sheep and Goats (Matthew 28:32-46) We all were created in the image of God. Jesus Christ says that the way we treat each other is the way we treat Him. The parable talks about providing basic, essential things... food, clothing, shelter, love,

companionship, etc. Who is our neighbor? Why do we turn away from our neighbor, even though we are given the commandment to love them? How can you (your youth group, your family) make a deliberate choice to love your neighbor?

READ AND REFLECT: Read and discuss the Parable of the Talents (Matthew 25: 14-30). Everyone has some type of talent or special gift, it just might not be obvious to you. Grab a friend or two (or sit down as a family). List the talents or gifts you think you have and discuss them with your family or friends. They might add a few things you might not have considered. Talents or gifts are not always the same as having riches or wealth. You might not be rich or powerful, but you might be great at cooking, you might be a natural leader, or you might be very talented at music or sports. How can you (your youth group, your family) make a deliberate choice to use your talents and gifts to help others and for the glory of God?

The Love of the Incarnate God By Father Christos Christakis

It was Christmas Eve in 1991, when as a young graduate student of Theology in London, England, I entered the Russian cathedral for the Christmas Liturgy. I still remember the sermon by Metropolitan Anthony (Bloom) and I try to keep it close to my heart every Nativity season.

That night Metropolitan Anthony invited those present to cast a glance at the people involved in the glorious, mysterious night of the Incarnation:

The **Mother of God**, perfectly given to God in all Her purity and in all Her humility. "We all are called," he said, "to open ourselves to God, we all are called to let God enter into our lives, fill each of us. "

Joseph who is bewildered both by the message of the Angel and by what is happening; How did he face his doubt and still remain in wonder? With faith, he accepted the fact that there are many things which cannot be understood with the intellect, but can be experienced. And he did, indeed, experienced what was going on: he saw the presence of the God Who have become man.

Then, Metropolitan Anthony invited the people to think of the Magi and of the shepherds.

The **Magi** were people of knowledge; but it is not science that gave them wisdom; because they were full of wonder, because they were open to the discovery of the unthinkable, they were brought to that place, where the unthinkable has taken place: the incarnation of God.

The **shepherds** were men without knowledge, but men who had purity of heart; they had simplicity; they were capable of listening to the message which the angels brought not only with their ears, but with their inmost self; they recognized the truth of the message because it gave them life, joy, hope – and they found Christ.

That night I realized that I needed to look at the world

in a radically different way. When we face the world that surrounds us, which is dark and mysterious, we need to learn to look at it with wonder. And this we can do ultimately only if we learn to have a pure heart, to cleanse ourselves from selfishness, from hatred, from everything that is darkness in our souls and in our lives.

From time to time, we will find ourselves face to face with the love of God, offering itself to us, awaiting from us a response: let us then give a response of our own love. This response is to be given not only to God Whom we do not see, but to everyone who surrounds us, because Christ has said to us, "Whatever you have done to one of these, you have done to Me." It is by loving concretely and actively those whom God sends us that we can learn the love of the Incarnate God.
