YOUTH NEWS Metropolis Youth Worker Training Seminars

THE METROPOLIS OFFICE OF YOUTH AND YOUNG ADULT MINISTRIES held two youth worker training workshops - one in September and one in October – to help better equip the incredible volunteers committed to parish youth ministries.

The seminars were offered at no cost to the participants thanks to the **Friends of the**

Metropolis and to the generous hospitality of the host parishes. Each parish offered their beautiful facilities and provided delicious meals for all those in attendance.

THE CENTRAL DISTRICT YOUTH WORKER TRAINING SEMINAR was held on September 24, 2016 at Holy Trinity Church in Carmel, IN. Fr. James Honeycutt, Priest at Annunciation Church in Muskegon, MI and Licensed Therapist, spoke about teenagers and how to better understand the stages of their development. Luke Beecham, Director of FOCUS Indianapolis/FOCUS North America, discussed outreach, philanthropy, and ways that youth can encounter Christ through serving others. Eva Konstantakos, Director of Youth and Young Adult Ministries of our Metropolis, offered a presentation on youth protection and practical ways to provide a safe and healthy environment for youth to grow in Christ.

THE MICHIGAN DISTRICT YOUTH WORKER TRAINING SEMINAR AND GOYA LEADERSHIP SUMMIT was held on October 1, 2016 at St. George Church in Southgate, MI. His Eminence Metropolitan Nicholas spoke about understanding WHY we believe as Orthodox Christians. Fr. Larry Legakis, Priest at Holy Trinity Cathedral in Toledo, OH, spoke about keeping focused on Christ and the importance of Family Ministry. Eva Konstantakos, Director of Youth and Young Adult Ministries of our Metropolis, led a group discussion and brainstorm session for improving/expanding youth and young adult ministries in the Michigan area.

Next year, the Metropolis Office of Youth and Young Adult Ministries plans to expand these seminars to more areas of the Metropolis. In addition, webinars (online video seminars) are being developed to reach more parishes and youth workers.

OUR METROPOLIS PHILOPTOCHOS BOARD will be hosting receptions on December 11 and 12 following the ST. SPYRIDON VESPERS AND DIVINE LITURGY. We hope you will consider attending one or both of these services at the Metropolis in Troy.

Philoptochos does not take a summer vacation. Our philanthropic work continued through the summer and went into high gear in September with the beginning of the Ecclesiastical year. We are celebrating our 85th Anniversary this year, a remarkable eighty-five years of philanthropy!

We wish to congratulate His All Holiness Patriarch Bartholomew on the occasion of the 25th Anniversary of his enthronement, celebrated on November 2, 2016.

For several years, as part of our literacy initiative, Philoptochos has collaborated with Nick Katsoris, author of the Loukoumi books. Several years ago Mr. Katsoris initiated the MAKE A DIFFERENCE DAY. This initiative was embraced by several national organizations and Philoptochos joined the movement in

2015. This is the nation's largest day of volunteering. The goal of the Make a Difference Day is to encourage our youth to do good deeds in honor of Archbishop Demetrios' Nameday on October 26. It is a cross-generational initiative, partnering Philoptochos members with other ministries in our parishes such as Sunday School and Greek School, GOYA, HOPE and JOY. This year, every **METROPOLIS PARTICIPATED AND COMPLETED OVER 10,000 GOOD DEEDS, SURPASSING THE GOAL OF 8,500.** Our Philoptochos chapter in Buffalo partnered with GOYA and baked cookies to serve guests in their Soup Kitchen. Other projects included making cards for US Veterans, making hygiene kits for the homeless and donating food and toys for shelter animals at the Humane Society. I am pleased that several chapters in our Metropolis participated, as it is important to show our younger generation the joy of giving.

Thanksgiving and Christmas are always a busy time for us as we hope to make the holidays a little happier for those in need by adopting families, taking kids shopping, giving food certificates, cooking food for the homeless and sharing our time by visiting those in nursing homes or assisted living facilities.

Plans are proceeding for our **SPRING LUNCHEON** to be held on **APRIL 29, 2017** at the St. Nicholas Church in Troy, Michigan. Our special **GUEST SPEAKER IS MISS AMERICA 2016, BETTY CANTRELL**. More information is forthcoming.

MEFGOX Wishes all of You the Blessings of the Feast of the Nativity!

AS THE BEAUTIFUL FEAST OF THE HOLY NATIVITY draws near, the choirs and chanters members of the Mid-Eastern Federation of Church Musicians extend their heartfelt good wishes to Metropolitan Nicholas, our Priests and Deacons, and all the parishioners of the Metropolis of Detroit.

During this joyful season, you will hear us singing and chanting the beautiful hymns that are sung for the Feast – they mark they feast, they instruct us in our faith, and they fill us with joy as we raise our voices to praise the birth of our Lord!

During the Divine Liturgy, there are several significant changes to the hymns you regularly hear on Sundays. During the Forefeast of the Nativity (November 26th until December 24th), the KONTAKION changes to "Today, the Virgin" ('H $\Pi \alpha \rho \theta \epsilon \nu o \zeta$ $\sigma \eta \mu \epsilon \rho o \nu$), signaling the forthcoming celebration:

Today, the Virgin comes unto the cave to give birth there to the Word before all time: beyond all words is this wonder! Dance with joy, all of creation, hearing these tidings. Along with the angels and the shepherds, glorify Him who willingly appears as a newborn baby, yet he is God before time.

On the actual Feast of the Nativity until the Leave-taking of the Feast (December 31st), the text of the **KONTAKION** alters again, now reflecting the Divine Birth:

Today, the Virgin bears Him who is transcendent, and the earth presents the cave to Him who is beyond reach. Angels, along with shepherds, glorify Him. The Magi make their way to Him by a star. For a new child has been born for us, the God before all ages.

On the Nativity, there is a special **APOLYTIKION** for the Nativity, which you will hear during the Small Entrance:

Your birth, O Christ our God, dawned the light of knowledge upon the earth. For by Your birth those who adored stars, were taught by a star, to worship You, the Sun of Justice and to know You, Orient from on High. (H Γ évvŋơή Σ ou)

The **MEGHALINARION**, usually "It is Truly Right" (Άξιον εστίν) changes to *"O Magnify My Soul."*

And the **COMMUNION HYMN** changes from "Praise the Lord" (**Αινείτε τον Κύριον**) to:

The Lord has sent redemption to His people. Alleluia! (Λύτρωσιν)

Someday is Not a Day of the Week

SO THE SAYING GOES. Nothing could be more true. Especially for those of us who are engaged in the spiritual struggles of Christian life. Too often in this life an individual or a Parish will choose to put off what they know needs to be done. Procrastination can be a most destructive force to the individual

and the Parish. We all must strive to see the value and significance we possess and do the things that are beneficial to our spiritual health and the vitality of our local church. It means that each and every one of us must not wait until tomorrow, or next week, or some distant date in the future to do the necessary things for our salvation and for the welfare of Christ's Church. We must always be conscious that the only reality we possess is the present. All our yesterdays have passed into history and we possess no guarantees of a tomorrow. For every difficult And last, from the Forefeast of the Nativity through the Afterfeast (December 31st), the **CANON OF THE NATIVITY** is proclaimed during Orthros:

Christ is born, Glorify Him! Christ comes from heaven; come to welcome Him! Christ is on earth; lift up your hearts! Sing to the Lord, O earth! Be exalted and sing with hearty gladness, O ye people, Sing His praise for He is glorified! (Χριστός Υεννάται)

decision and effort that life presents there is a great reward waiting if we act in a timely and responsible fashion. Our Church is a precious gift and each person should be committed to improve it, sustain it and protect it. There is no time better than this day, this hour, and this moment. St. Herman of Alaska says: "From this day forward, from this hour, from this very minute *let us love God and fulfill His holy will."* There are benefits and blessings waiting for each individual and parish that chooses to act now and not wait for "someday" to arrive. David, the author of the Old Testament Psalms. writes: "This is the day the Lord has made; let us be glad and rejoice in it." Remember, there is no time like the present to address the myriad of challenges, issues or opportunities that life presents to us as individual Christians and as a fellowship of believers. In the end the blessings and rewards will be abundantly evident and will provide a more blessed and brighter tomorrow for all. Therefore, let us stand up, make the sign of the Cross in the name of the Father, Son and Holy Spirit and make a new beginning each and every day.
