METROPOLITAN NICHOLAS' MESSAGE

It is surely a true saying that in order to know where we are going to, we must know where we are coming from.

Some people see the world in terms of a physical cycle of events, e.g., the Big Bang Theory and evolution. In this vision, the world is oftentimes no more than an accident which has happened. It is without any fundamental purpose or need.

Others contemplate a vision that has no beginning and no end: such people think in terms of the passage of time in terms of a persistent circular movement of life which has its end in nothingness and the elimination of being.

But the Christian understanding of creation and life is very different. Everything has come into being by the direct act of God; in fact, we are the creation



made by God's own hands. (Psalm 117/118: 73)

Therefore, we have a godly start and beginning, and are not accidental but a part of God's plan of creation.

We are called upon to see the passage of time not as a meaningless cycle of events. Rather, for the Christian, time is the gift which God gives us to do His work on the earth.

Time gives us the opportunity to change and to fulfill our divine calling. By imitating the life of our Lord Jesus Christ, time allows us to exercise our call to holiness.

Time also is given to us to share the Good News of the Gospel. Time is not just for personal prayer and reflection: each day we are offered the opportunity to tell others of His mighty deeds.

And time is also given to us to share in the work of God on this earth: to offer help, hope, and mercy to all in need, emulating the life of our Lord. We are to be beacons of hope in the midst of darkness.

Having entered a new period of time with this decade of 2010, we pray that all of us will make time for God in our lives; that our clocks will be set by the peal of His Heavenly Kingdom; and that because of our love for Him, we will love each other!

has joined in an effort to offer help and hope to this beleaguered nation.


The Ecumenical Patriarchate has also released an urgent appeal for assistance and relief to be gathered throughout the world to be sent to Haiti.




