We thank Mr. Paul Sieben, Festival Chairperson, as well as all of the parish donors and volunteers who gave their time and resources to make the event so successful.



Punch and hors d'oeuvres were served in the beautifully decorated fellowship hall where members had an opportunity to visit with one another before the program was begun and lunch was served. During the fellowship hour we enjoyed the music of The Vutones musical group. We were honored that Metropolitan Nicholas was able to attend and present a yellow rose to each of the forty-nine past presidents from our Metropolis who were in attendance. Five past presidents who were planning on attending had to cancel because of last minute unexpected commitments.

Thank you to all the Metropolis Board who worked to make the luncheon a success, to Metropolitan Nicholas and Board members for donating the beautiful raffle prizes, to our sponsors and to our hosts, The Holy Trinity Philoptochos, for their hospitality. A special thank you to our co-chairs, Pauline Biernacki of Toledo and Evanthia Valassiades of Dayton. It was truly a joyous occasion as we celebrated those who worked so hard in past years to carry out the mission of Philoptochos.

The Dayton Philoptochos is collecting monetary donations and "wish list" items for the Fisher House, which helps house military families of service men and women requiring hospitalization and medical attention.

The members of the Philoptochos in Buffalo held a farewell reception for Fr. Perikles Kallis, their assistant priest, and his family. He is now the Proistamenos at Holy Trinity in Waterbury, CT. They also coordinated a church team to walk in a fundraiser for Autism awareness. As mentioned previously, the members collected IOCC baby kits in honor of the Kallis family and presented the new baby with a baby quilt that was signed by 100 of the parishioners.

Several chapters throughout the Metropolis held spiritual retreats during the Lenten season, also attended by members from other

chapters. The majority of the chapters held Palm Sunday luncheons, dyed red Easter eggs and helped to decorate the Epitaphion.

When you come to our sacred Liturgy, do you take one important aspect of your worship for granted? I refer to the beauty of our traditional Byzantine-style music, whether it is one voice chanting or with a choir singing the traditional hymns in four-part harmonies.

Do you also take for granted the contribution of your Greek Orthodox Church Musicians?

If one took the time to consider the many kinds of musicians we have who take part in the Liturgy, you would be surprised at the levels of training and commitment your musicians display.

Our Metropolitans, Priests and Deacons have been trained at a seminary in the chants of the Liturgy, which lead you to your prayers. A large number of our chanters have trained for many years, in Greece or in the United States, to learn the eight modes of our music and how each hymn they provide fits into them. Think of all the special hymns they chant during Holy Week. Most of our choir directors are trained musicians who lead our singers in their responses to the Clergy on behalf of the "laos", the people. The choir members, almost all of whom are volunteers, not only sing every Sunday, but attend regular rehearsals to become proficient under the director's leadership. He Has Revealed Himself To Us

During Orthros, after the reading of the Psalms as well as in other services such as *Paraklesis*, we hear a special and a very short hymn "God is the Lord and has revealed Himself to us...". I say these words in my daily prayers knowing that they are ancient in origin and that they are speaking about mystery revealed. God the Lord has revealed Himself to us! Our Holy Church exists through the belief that God has revealed Himself to us. This idea of God appearing is a source of strength to all who have faith in the person of Jesus Christ.


The God who appeared to us appeared in our physical history. It is through His plan of salvation for each and every one of us that on the day of Pentecost, fifty days after Pascha, He reveals to us the Holy Spirit, the Comforter, the One who brings wisdom, strength, and courage to our lives. It is through the Holy Spirit that our Lord shows us His love and, very importantly, His purpose for each of us in this world. Many people try to show or prove that God exists. Faith is not about proof of God's existence; faith is about individual acceptance that God is!

The Church began its mission of Christianity on the day of Pentecost. One could argue that the Church has always existed, but it is on this day that a few fishermen are sent out to change the world forever. On this day our Lord's holy disciples received the Holy Spirit upon them as flaming tongues and established through the Holy Spirit a Faith in a God who revealed Himself to us! As Orthodox Christians, we cannot separate the Church from Faith. We cannot know Christ, or the Holy Spirit, or God the Father—the Holy Trinity, outside of His Holy Church that He has established. This has been proclaimed by the Saints from the beginning of Christianity. In the Church we proclaim His faith, and we help to maintain that faith through the Sacramental life, starting with our baptism.

Recently, we had the graduation of the high school seniors from Sunday School. Those in the ministry of teaching the faith, such as our dedicated Sunday School teachers, do their best to show a God who has been revealed. These teachers try to impart their love for God and His Church. But no one can really teach you how to have faith, or what
