The scholarship will be awarded to one student in the amount of \$1,000.00. All information herein is strictly confidential and the identity will not be disclosed to the selection committee.

Dear Applicant:

Please read through the entire set of instructions and application form before completing. Answer each question to the best of your knowledge. Applicants (male or female) must be a member of the Greek Orthodox Church and related to a Philoptochos member. Ignoring instructions may disqualify your application.

1. Complete the entire application available on the Metropolis website: www.detroit.goarch.org.
2. Include a Letter of Recommendation from a non-relative who will write of your character, ideals and values. It could be a priest, teacher or anyone who knows you well and can address these aspects of your character. It is recommended that you limit the letter to one page in length.
3. Statement of Orthodoxy indicating that the applicant is a practicing Orthodox Christian and a U.S. resident.
4. Statement of Stewardship from the Parish Priest certifying that the applicant or the applicant's family are Stewards in good standing in a Metropolis of Detroit parish.
5. Include all supporting documents required of the application.
